

Political Science and Criminal Justice: Tenure-Track

The Department of Political Science and Criminal Justice at the University of South Alabama invites applications for a full-time (9 month), tenure-track Assistant Professor position in Political Science to begin August 15, 2025. An earned Ph.D. in Political Science, Public Policy, or a closely related field is required at the time of appointment. ABDs currently near the completion of the degree are welcome to apply, but an earned Ph.D. is required at the time of appointment.

Department of Political Science and Criminal Justice faculty are known for their research, award-winning teaching, and collegiality. Our departmental faculty have earned multiple grants, teaching awards, scholarship awards, and published research in top research journals such as *Spine*. The Department offers the Master of Public Administration degree and a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and a Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice. Our growing and dynamic graduate program currently offers three concentrations: Health Administration, Criminal Justice Administration, and Geographic Information Technology, with anticipated development of new concentrations in the future.

Applicants must have teaching and research interests in the area of Political Science and/or closely related subfields and demonstrate a history or ability to publish in Political Science outlets. The primary expectation is that a successful candidate is able to teach undergraduate courses in political science, but there may be opportunities to teach electives in our graduate program. In addition to research and teaching, the successful candidate will be expected to advise a diverse student body, many of whom are first-generation college students. Service to the college and the community are highly important aspects of the position. Our department encourages candidates from all backgrounds, including historically underrepresented groups, to apply. We seek candidates with unique backgrounds and life experiences which will contribute to our ever-growing department.

Home to approximately 14,000 students, the University of South Alabama is a dynamic community of leaders and learners who support and challenge one another to be actively engaged citizens who advance the Gulf Coast Region and make a global impact. The University has implemented a strategic plan that is organized around five major priorities: Student Access and Success; Enhancement of research and Graduate Education, Global Engagement, Excellence in Health Care, and University Community Engagement.
